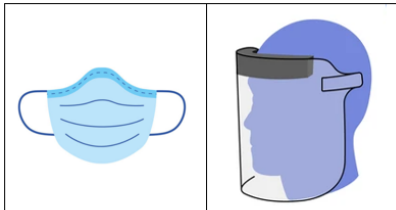

Feel Good Friday

KS1 sessions run Friday from 1:30 – 2:00pm <https://youtu.be/qssE95qVJ3M>

Band Leader Paul will cover:

- What makes up a band?: Paul will introduce the children to the part that each instrument plays in a band.
- Rocksteady Rhythms: Paul challenges the children to another game of Rocksteady rhythms where the children learn to recognise, repeat and listen out for certain rhythms.
- Rock Ready! The children put the work they have done over the last few weeks on 'We Will Rock You' to the test by performing their singing/body percussion parts with Paul playing along on the instruments.
- Mega Mix: Paul finishes with a mega mix of some of our favourite Rocksteady songs... and some of your requests!
