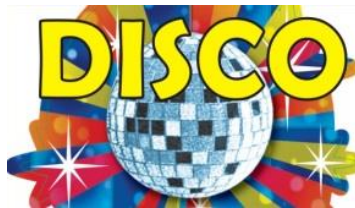
### Year 1/2 Disco

We want to encourage participants to think about racism and produce their own work about this serious issue. The work can be hand drawn or computer generated but must be original work.

Each participant will receive a voucher entitling them to two free tickets for the game.

Two prizes will be awarded in each age category and the overall winning poster will appear in the Barrow matchday programme.

The presentation of prizes will take place on the pitch at half time and the winning posters will be displayed in the clubhouse.

The artwork must not exceed A3 size (297 x 420mm).

Each participant can only submit one entry.

An independent panel of judges will select the winning entries.

This is a unique opportunity for schools to become proactively involved in the commitment to equality and tackling racism.
