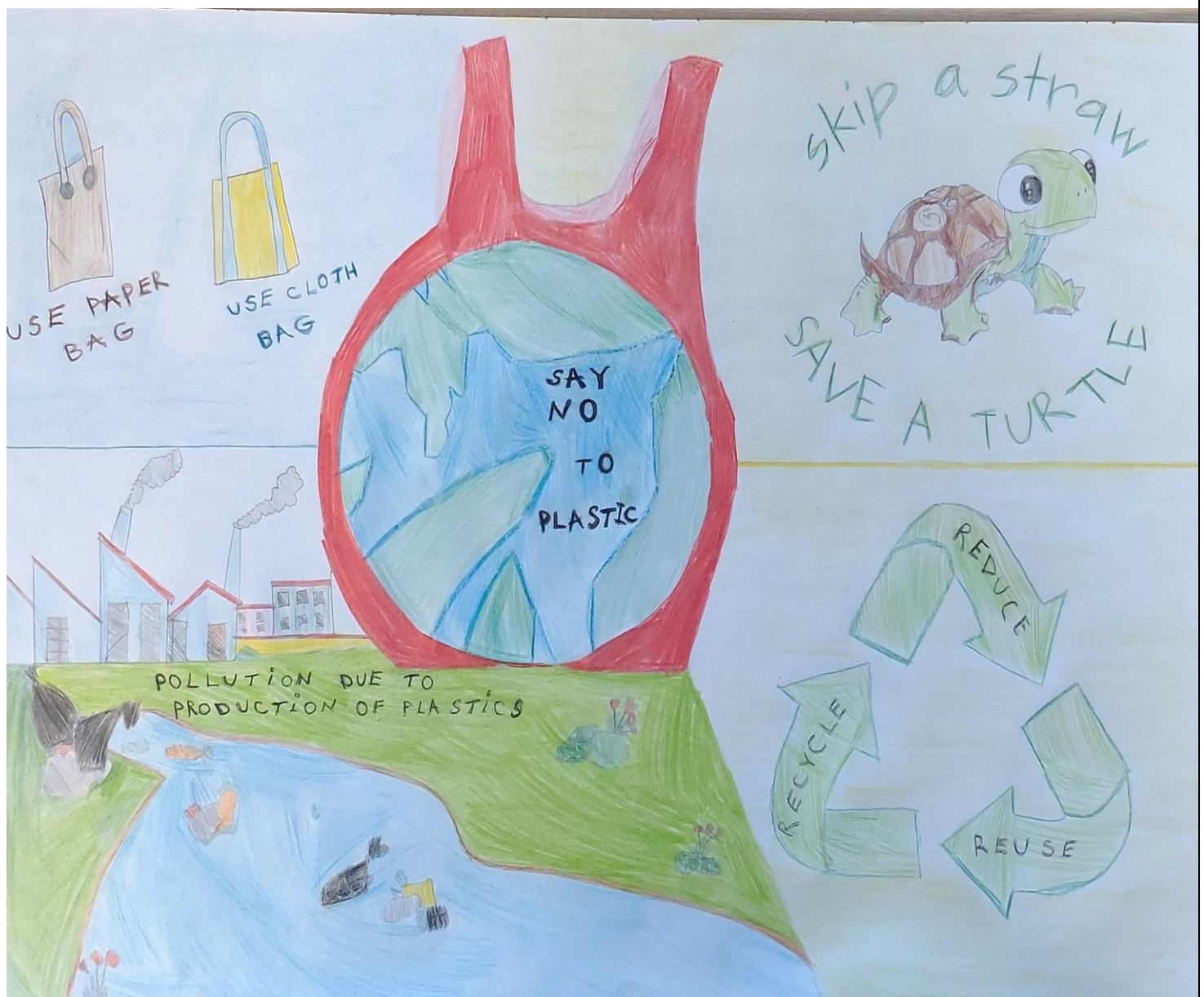

















Environmental Art - Bottle Tops

GOLD	Exceptional Behaviour. Significant Achievement. Constantly displaying "silver" behaviour.	Given golden pencil and certificate in Rewards Assembly. Sticker given in class. Entered on Integris			
SILVER	Consistent politeness. Selfless Behaviour. Constantly displaying "bronze" behaviour without adult prompting.	Silver certificate will be presented in Rewards Assembly. Sticker given in class. Entered on Integris			
BRONZE	Better than expected behaviour / effort. Being polite / kind / caring / sharing. Volunteering to help adults / children. Good manners. Picking up coats in corridor unprompted.	"Well done" bronze sticker given in class Entered on Integris			
GREEN	FOLLOW OUR "STAY ON GREEN" EXPECTED BEHAVIOUR.				
Warning – Child is reminded of "Green Behaviour"					
BLUE	Any low level disruption such as, talking in class, not listening. Constant fiddling with belongings. Calling out, disturbing others. Running / Careless pushing in the corridor. Arguing with peers. Littering.	Child's name is put in the "blue" section of the classroom display and told why their behaviour is not acceptable. Child's name entered on Integris			
Warning – Child is reminded of "Green Behaviour"					
YELLOW	Persistent "blue" behaviour. Deliberate pushing in the corridor. Throwing things across the classroom. Deliberately hurting someone's feelings. Being uncooperative / ignoring staff. Mild swearing or lying / answering back. Being unkind or rude. Fighting.	Child is given a Reflection Sheet and sent to the YGL or Buddy Teacher for 5-10 minutes depending on age. Reflection time with Behaviour Lead or Learning Mentor. Child's name entered on Integris.			
Warning – Child is reminded of "Green Behaviour"					
RED	Racism. Fighting with intent to hurt. Bullying (proven). Deliberately damaging property. Swearing directed at another. Persistent or serious lying. Persistent or premeditated stealing. Violence/Serious disobedience. Spitting at someone. Biting where a mark has been left (not EYFS). Persistent "yellow" behaviour.	Immediate lunch time detention with HT or SLT KS2 pupils miss "green time" on Friday. Child's name entered on Integris and letter sent home. Each time a child appears on red in a week they do a lunchtime detention.

- Red gingham dress



From Monday 13 June 2022 the council intends to introduce a School Street at Hunters Hall Primary School to reduce traffic and improve road safety at pick up and drop off times.

The plans will make part of Alibon Road and Rockwell Road outside the school a pedestrian and cycle-only zone from the hours of **8am to 9.15am** and **2.45pm to 4pm** during term time.

Our aim is to transform the busy, congested and polluted road outside the school gate into a safer, healthier and more pleasant environment, and reduce the nuisance caused to local residents during the school run. We will operate the School Street for an initial 12 month period.

Children are exposed to up to **five times** higher pollution levels at the school gates



School run traffic accounts for **1 in 4 cars** on the road at peak times

40% of fatal road accidents involving children happen during school run hours



Pollution levels are often **higher** inside the car than outside

We are also working with children and parents to encourage walking, cycling and scooting to school. We would welcome your support with this so that everyone in the area can enjoy the benefits of quieter, safer roads.

Who is exempt?

No vehicles will be allowed into the school street zone during operating hours unless they have an exemption. Emergency services vehicles are automatically exempt.

Otherwise, you can apply for an exemption only if:

- you are a resident living within the School Street zone, or if you run a business within the zone
- you are a blue badge holder who requires immediate and regular access to the school
- you are a carer of a resident living within the zone, or you are a carer of a disabled or SEN child attending the school who needs to be dropped outside the school entrance, or
- you are a member of school staff.

Anyone who drives through the School Street zone without a permit may be liable to a penalty charge notice.

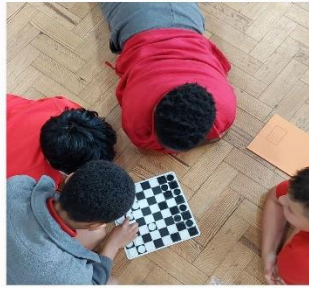

To celebrate Her Majesty, The Queen's Platinum Jubilee, we will be holding a special event on Friday 10th June 2022.

All year groups will design Heptagonal 70p A4 size bunting. The design will have The Queen's portrait/profile on one side and an image linked to British Values (**Democracy, Rule of Law, Respect and Tolerance, Individual Liberty**) on the reverse that celebrates our community and diversity.

One 70p coin design from each class will be chosen and enlarged to A3 and laminated. This will be displayed on either Rockwell Road gates or Alibon gates for our school community to see.

There will also be a chance for parents/carers to showcase their design skills by helping their children to design and make a Jubilee hat/cap (inspired by the Queen's love of headwear. –All staff and children will be encouraged to partake.
