Dear Parent/Carer,

We hope this finds you keeping well and having a positive start to 2022.

We recall the days when a system was put in place and it lasted for the whole academic year! The pandemic has changed many aspects of how we work and has forced us all to deal with a more fluid approach as systems change on a regular basis.

The notable change, this time, is the reduction of the time of self-isolation for positive Covid cases. From Monday, if someone with Covid has a negative test on day 5 and a further negative test 24 hours later, then they can return to school or work having completed a minimum of 5 full days' isolation. (Please refer to the item on Lateral Flow Testing further on in Snippets). Having these two negative tests is essential to ensure we do not infect others. Although the Omicron variant seems a milder illness for most, we must remember that some vulnerable people can become very ill. Our community will always be stronger if we all take a collective responsibility for the health and wellbeing of all.

Whilst the overwhelming majority of our community are supportive of each other and notice how their choices impact on others, we are still witnessing some incredibly selfish behaviour as parents bring their children to school. Sometimes parents are showing total disregard for the highway code and park where it suits them despite the danger this puts others in. There are others who may be keeping within the rules of the highway code but certainly are not considering any other member of our school community.


Please consider if your actions whilst bringing your child/ren to school impacts on another's safety. Do not park or stop your car exactly opposite the school gates. Do not turn your car by driving or reversing up on the pavement. Over 600 children and their parents are walking on the pavements at this time – we ask each person to act responsibly to keep all our children and school community safe.

All items should be named.


Also could you please ensure that all earrings are removed. If not, then they will be taped up at the office.

Guidance

Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection

Updated 11 January 2022

As we continue to have reports of positive cases in school, we remind all of you to regularly test your household. This is to keep all members of our community safe.

If you need to order further tests please visit: gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests

If the lateral flow is positive, then updated government advice states that isolation commences immediately and a confirmatory PCR is not required to verify the result.

When submitting positive result information to school, please send the official NHS confirmation text/email message.

From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the selfisolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be <u>reported to NHS Test and Trace</u>.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.
