Please have a healthy, safe Easter and I will be in touch with you all again next week.

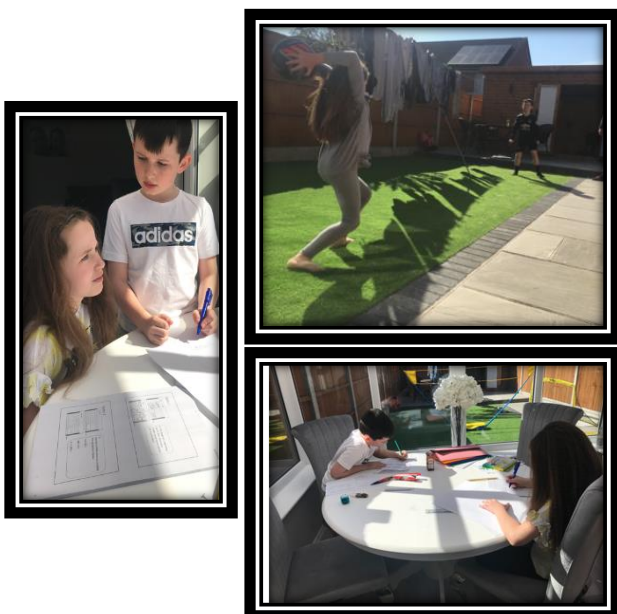

The rules

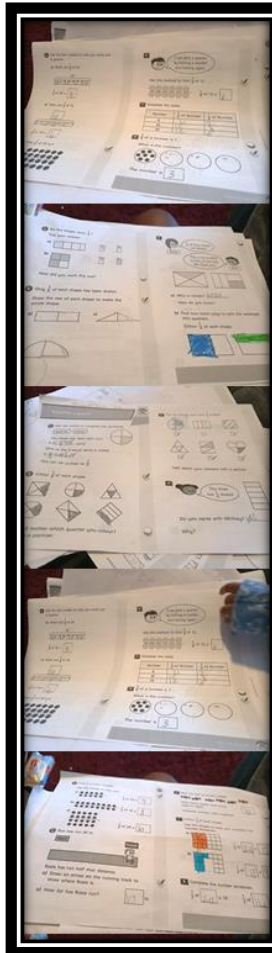
- One entry per person. Please make sure it is all your own work.
