
Reception School Place 2021

Due to the new lockdown restrictions the Monday afternoon uniform shop in school is being temporarily **closed**.





How to make a leaf rose

You will need:



- some leaves (ones with lobes (sticking-out parts) work best)
- a stick
- some string

| Place a leaf over the top of the end of the stick. | |
|--|--|
| Fold a leaf in half and wrap it around the stick. Repeat a few times. | |
| Begin wrapping leaves around the stick with the lobes sticking up above the centre. | |
| Keep wrapping more leaves around the stick, overlapping them. | |
| 5. Use larger leaves as you add more and wrap them a little looser so the leaves splay out a little. | |
| Finally secure the leaves with some string, keep winding until the stems are hidden. | |

Some activities will take place online during this lockdown period, but there's also something to look forward to post lockdown




