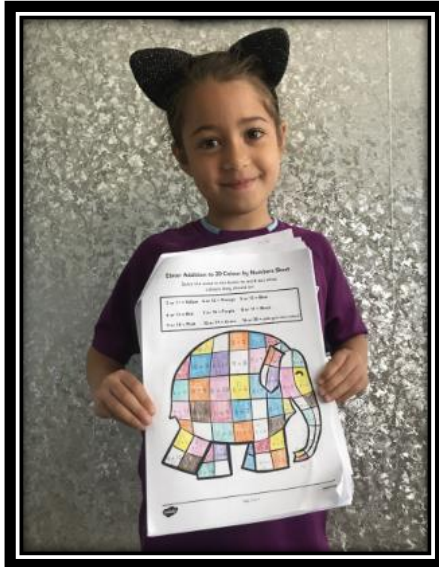
### Quackerteeny

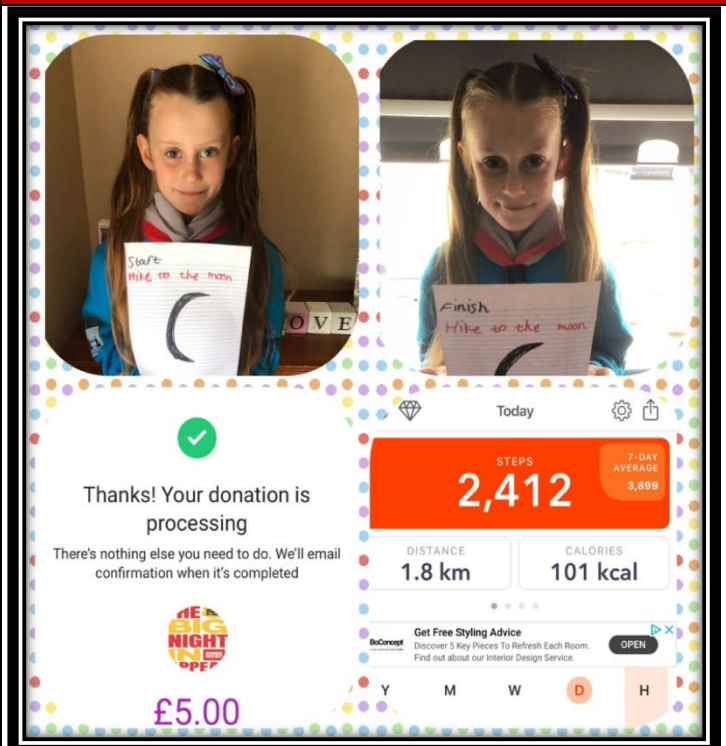

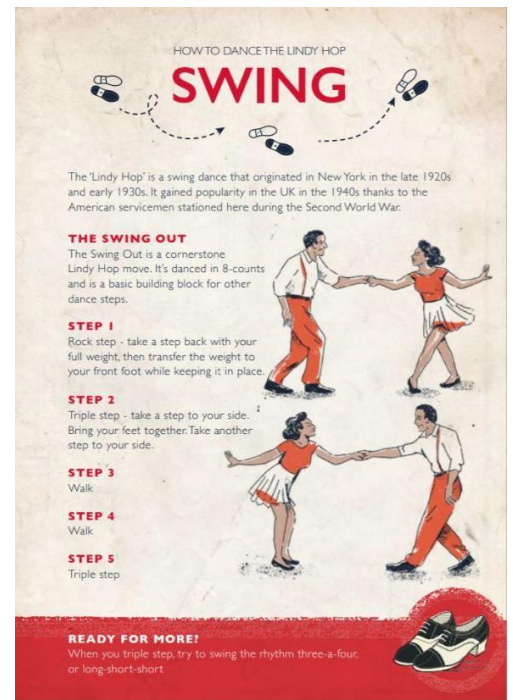
