We look forward to taking part next year where hopefully different year groups will be able to contribute.



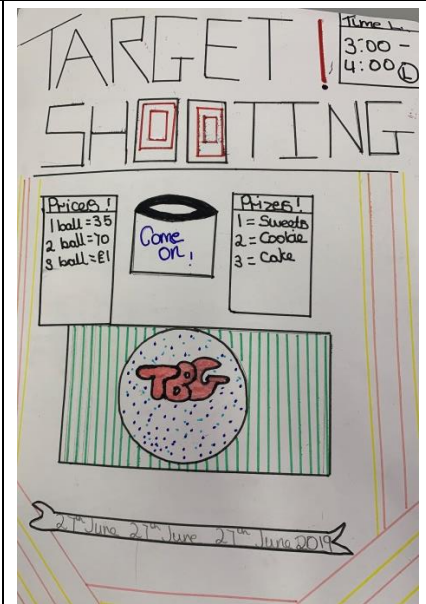

Kids Walk

On Wednesday 26 June 2019, more than 100,000 children, aged 4-11, will put their best feet forward to take part in a Brake's Kids Walk and promote road safety and the health and planet-saving benefits of walking. Brake's Kids Walk is a short, supervised walk, involving thousands of children walking at the same time to promote important road safety messages. Children walk in pairs in crocodile formation, while holding hands, to emphasise the importance of being able to walk without fear or threat from traffic.

Brake's Kids Walk is a great way to inspire and engage children about the dangers they face and raise awareness among parents and the wider community about the need to protect children on roads. It's also a great opportunity to fundraise for Brake and support families who have lost loved ones in road crashes.
