Dog Safety

Leading animal welfare organisations have teamed up to produce a shareable infographic to encourage safe interactions with dogs.

The Canine and Feline Sector Group Dog Safety Code highlights three crucial messages that all dog owners and families need to know:

Following on from yesterday's magnificent Afternoon Tea, which saw our parent body come together as one.

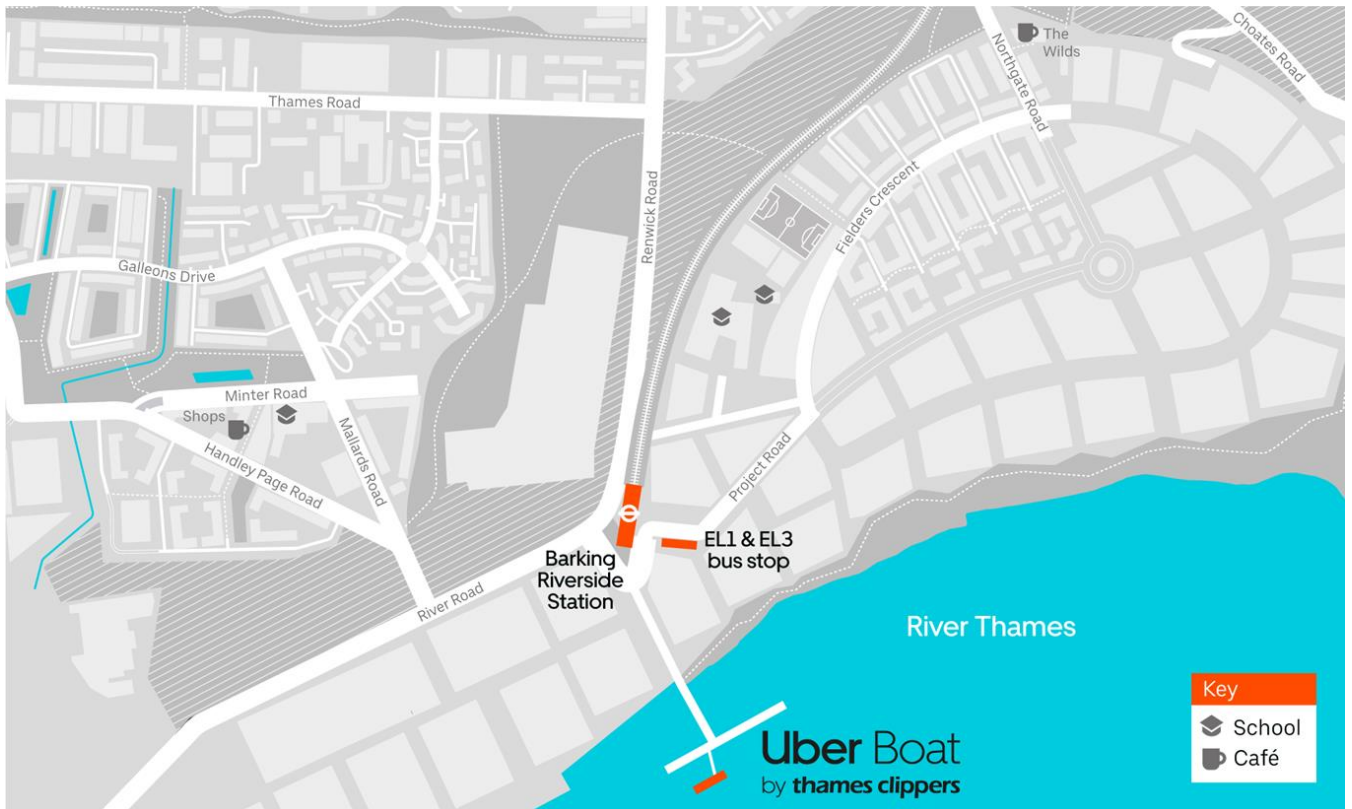

The children will have a multitude of tales to tell their own children about how they celebrated The Queen's Jubilee year when they are older and reflecting back on this time period.

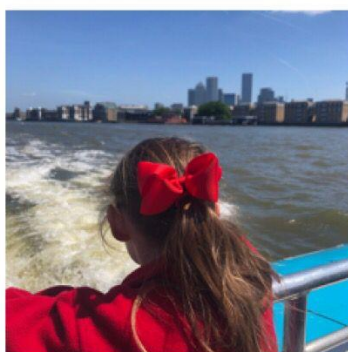
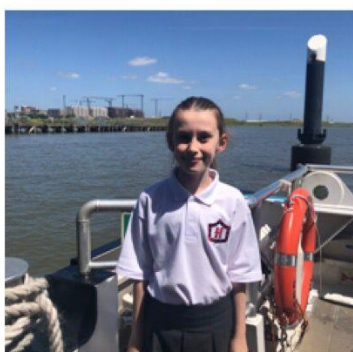
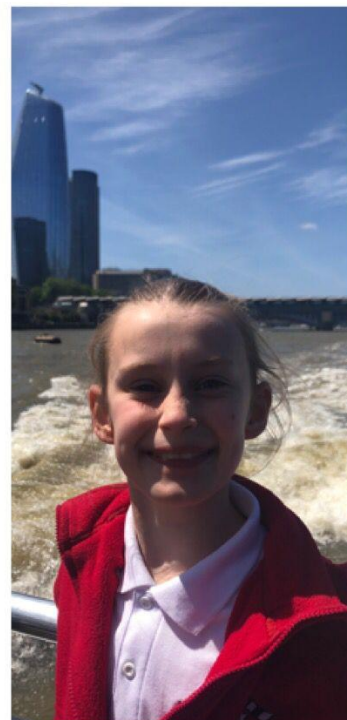
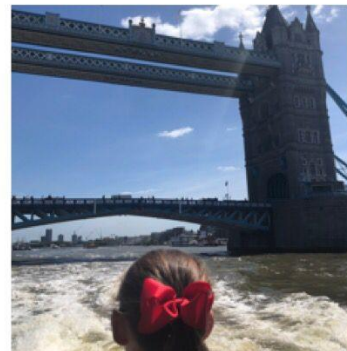
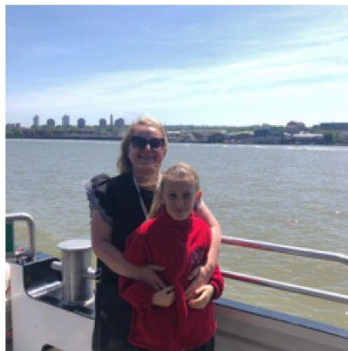
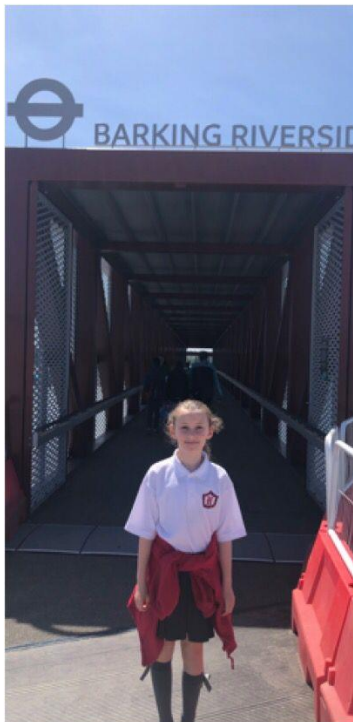

From 13 June 2022 we will be making it safer for our children to get to **Hunters Hall Primary School**

From Monday 13 June 2022 the council intends to introduce a School Street at Hunters Hall Primary School to reduce traffic and improve road safety at pick up and drop off times.

The plans will make part of Alibon Road and Rockwell Road outside the school a pedestrian and cycle-only zone from the hours of **8am to 9.15am** and **2.45pm to 4pm** during term time.

Our aim is to transform the busy, congested and polluted road outside the school gate into a safer, healthier and more pleasant environment, and reduce the nuisance caused to local residents during the school run. We will operate the School Street for an initial 12 month period.

We are also working with children and parents to encourage walking, cycling and scooting to school. We would welcome your support with this so that everyone in the area can enjoy the benefits of quieter, safer roads.

Who is exempt?

No vehicles will be allowed into the school street zone during operating hours unless they have an exemption. Emergency services vehicles are automatically exempt.

Otherwise, you can apply for an exemption only if:

- you are a resident living within the School Street zone, or if you run a business within the zone
- you are a blue badge holder who requires immediate and regular access to the school
- you are a carer of a resident living within the zone, or you are a carer of a disabled or SEN child attending the school who needs to be dropped outside the school entrance, or
- you are a member of school staff.

Anyone who drives through the School Street zone without a permit may be liable to a penalty charge notice.

Children are exposed to up to **five times** higher pollution levels at the school gates



School run traffic accounts for **1 in 4 cars** on the road at peak times

40% of fatal road accidents involving children happen during school run hours



Pollution levels are often **higher** inside the car than outside

LBBD to become a Specialist Hub for Girls Football



In March 2019, Barclays announced the biggest ever investment in UK women's sport by a brand. As part of this commitment, they are supporting the Barclays Girls' Football School Partnerships (BGFSP), established to solely focus on ensuring girls in England have equal access to football in schools by 2024. After the submission of a successful application, Barking and Dagenham have been formally invited to join the girls football network from September 2022. The Physical Activities Team will form a specialist hub, delivering girls' football programmes in PE or Games lessons, supporting teachers in primary schools with training and resources.

This builds on the ticketing partnership with West Ham United Women's Team from this season where over 250 free tickets to home matches were distributed to young people and their families through schools.
