



Safeguarding Update

Tackling Child Abuse (HM Government/DfE)

The government has launched a campaign called 'Together we can tackle child abuse'. The resources, aimed at everyone in the community, could be used with parents and include four very short videos explaining physical abuse, emotional abuse, sexual abuse, neglect and online abuse.

The simple mnemonic, ABC, is used to remind people that they should look out for changes in appearance, behaviour or communication. The webpage has a search engine to find out where to report abuse.

Criminal Exploitation

It is really hard to believe that we would be in a situation where children of primary school age could be involved in gangs, but unfortunately it is a reality in our area.

What is a gang?

The word 'gang' means different things in different contexts, the government in their paper 'Safeguarding children and young people who may be affected by gang activity' distinguishes between peer groups, street gangs and organised criminal gangs.1

Peer group

A relatively small and transient social grouping which may or may not describe themselves as a gang depending on the context.

Street gang

"Groups of young people who see themselves (and are seen by others) as a discernible group for whom crime and violence is integral to the group's identity."

Organised criminal gangs

"A group of individuals for whom involvement in crime is for personal gain (financial

or otherwise). For most crime is their 'occupation."

It's not illegal for a young person to be in a gang – there are different types of 'gang' and not every

'gang' is criminal or dangerous. However, gang membership can be linked to illegal activity,

particularly organised criminal gangs involved in trafficking, drug dealing and violent crime.

PAUSE, ROOT, AND BREATHE

Self-care means managing stress proactively. Sleep, exercise, eating-well, and positive social relationships are all part of self-care too. But, your own emotion regulation -- your own ability to notice stress and breathe through it, is key to filling your own cup. We cannot pour from an empty cup and we cannot teach our children emotion-regulation if we do not practice it ourselves.

NOTICE STRESS AND PAUSE

THE FIRST STEP WHEN YOU NOTICE THAT YOU ARE FEELING STRESSED OR TRIGGERED IS TO SIMPLY PAUSE.

STOPPING GIVES OUR BRAIN A CHANCE TO USE REASONING AND PROBLEM SOLVING INSTEAD OF REACTING.

PAUSE

AND OBSERVE THAT YOUR CHILD HAS BIG EMOTIONS.

TO THOSE EMOTIONS --STOP AND OBSERVE.

ROOT IN PLACE AND BREATHE

ENGAGE YOUR CORE
AND PLANT YOUR FEET
INTO THE GROUND,
DRAWING ON YOUR
INNER STRENGTH.
