Dear Parent/Carer,

After last week's celebration and sharing of our corridor displays based on our reconnecting curriculum, I thought I would share further information on our Zones of Regulation.

We all feel agitated, annoyed, sad or angry at times. It is important for our mental health that we acknowledge this but deal with it in a healthy way. If it's anger; politely telling someone that you want them to stop saying or doing something hurtful and then walking away should stop the anger rising and causing damage to ourselves and them.

Our Zones of Regulation focuses on how or what we can do to bring ourselves from emotions of anger, sadness etc and into a calmer space. Firstly, we teach the children to identify what zone they are in and then successful ways to self-regulate are explored, such as: breathing in through the nose for a count of 4 and slowly and steadily out through the nose for a count of 6 or more; moving a pencil from one hand to the other repeatedly, etc.

Please ask your child to explain how the Zones of Regulation works for them and support them using it at home.

I wish you all a happy weekend in the green zone.

Do not send your child to school if:


- they are showing coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms

Year 3 - Flatbread Recipe

This week in Year 3 the children made Egyptian Flat Bread and were keen to have the recipe so they could make them at home. Enjoy!

Egyptian Flat Bread


Makes 5 flat breads

250g plain flour (plus extra for dusting)

- 1 tsp salt
- 4 tbsp olive oil
- 100ml of milk



- First, preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- Second, sensibly whisk flour and salt together in a bowl; form a well in the centre. Add milk and oil; mix until smooth dough forms.
- Next, quickly turn dough out onto a lightlyfloured work surface; knead until smooth and pliable, 10 to 15 minutes. Set dough aside to rest for 15 minutes.
- 4. Then, carefully divide dough into 4 equal pieces; roll out each piece with a rolling pin to 1/4-inch thickness. Arrange on prepared baking sheet.
- 5. Finally, bake in the preheated oven until lightly browned, 8 to 10 minutes.
