



Home School agreement

The relationship between the home and school is very important. The aim of the agreement is to develop this relationship, so that children may receive the best possible education. Both school and parents have an important role to play and we hope the agreement makes this clear. All schools are required to publish their home-school agreement and associated parental declaration.

A home-school agreement is a statement explaining:

- the school's aims and values;
- the school's responsibilities towards its pupils who are of compulsory school age;
- the responsibility of each pupil's parents/carers;
- what the school expects of its pupils.

At Hunters Hall we aim to:-

- Set high standards and expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge every child.
- Promote good progress and outcomes for all pupils.
- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum matched as far as possible to the needs of the individual.
- Value each child as an individual and encourage them to achieve in all aspects of school life.
- Maintain a code of conduct that provides a caring, safe and well-disciplined environment.
- Provide parents with information about their children's progress and general school matters using a range of communication techniques.
- Be welcoming and open towards parents and provide opportunities for parents to become involved in the life of the school.

Parents/carers aim to:-

- Bring their children to school on time every day. Collect their children on time at the end of the day.
- Keep the school informed on end of day collection arrangements and provide up to date information for emergency contacts.
- Inform the school office on the first day that their child is absent.
- Support high standards of behaviour and work, and guide children to complete their homework.
- Attend school events such as parent/carer evenings.
- Let the school know of any problems, which might affect a child's work or behaviour.
- Support school staff regarding behaviour/ disciplinary matters.
- Support all school policies.
- Take note of parking restrictions around the school and park accordingly so as to ensure the safety of all children on their way to and from school.
- Model appropriate behaviour when in the vicinity of the school.

Pupils aim to:-

- Treat everyone with politeness and respect.
- Work as hard as they can.
- Help everybody to stay safe.
- Listen to each other.
- Respect the school environment.
