#### Junior Citizen

Teaching children in year six (ages 10 or 11) about how to keep safe in everyday life.

The Junior Citizens Trust has been in existence since 1991 and is offered to every year six pupil.

During their two hour visit all children experience eight different safety scenarios and each child is given the opportunity to practice making a 999 telephone call. All learning sessions are designed to be interactive, where children are taught a variety of life skills which focus upon how to keep themselves safe whilst potentially helping others who may be in difficulty or distress.

Based on the controlled learning experiences provided, children are encouraged to make decisions which they may face during a real life emergency. Following attendance, each child receives a free work book to allow the learning experience to continue back at school or at home.

The Junior Citizens Trust mission statement is "to provide education to children and young persons on a wide range of health and safety issues".

## Rock Steady

Five bands began to take shape on Tuesday. Every week the bands consisting of two keyboards, three electric guitars, two electric drums and two vocalists will be developing their musicianship, ably assisted by Kerrie Smith from Rock Steady, in preparation for a concert towards the end of the term.



#### Year 3 Tate Visit

Our Year Three children and teaching staff took part in the Tate Gallery Photography Project today. The project with Turner Prize and Oscar-winning artist, Steve McQueen, is a major new artwork, which will culminate in one of the most ambitious schools' projects that London has ever seen. All Year



3 pupils, alongside every Year 3 class across London have been invited to take part in the largest group portrait ever made. This will be an epic picture of our city's pupils and our rich civic diversity in a unique programme for London's seven and eight-year-olds to explore their hopes and futures in an entirely free to access programme focussed on identity, belonging, inclusion and citizenship. The photographs will be centre stage for six months next year in the prestigious Duveen Galleries at Tate Britain. By taking part, pupils will see themselves in one of the most compelling British artworks of our time at the heart of the nation's collection. In years to come our Year Three children will be able to share this photo with their own children and grandchildren.
