Dear Parent/Carer.

For some time, we have had an increasing number of children being collected from the school office rather than their classroom at the end of the school day. This has been causing overcrowding in the entrance to the school so we are bringing in new measures to ensure all our children remain safe.

If you are collecting your child later than the school given hours (Reception, Yr1 and 2 at 3pm: Yrs 3,4,5 and 6 at 3:05pm), you will no longer collect them from the school office.

- If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, you will collect them from the cabin in the infant playground.
- If your child is in Year 3 or Year 4, you will collect them from the cabin in the pagoda playground.
- If your child is in Year 5 or 6, you will collect them from the new shelter in the corner of the ball playing playground.

If your child has an unavoidable appointment to attend, please notify the school as early as possible and please show proof of the appointment on your phone or on paper. Children will not be released without appointment proof.

The above measures have had to be brought in as overcrowding whilst opening the main exit doors, and staff being distracted by queries, could compromise our commitment to safeguarding every child and increases the stress of our staff dealing with end of day issues. Thank you for your understanding.

You have already received notice of the classes which will be closed due to the NEU strike next Wednesday, 1st February. Work for these classes **will not** be posted but there are the usual links to learning on our school website:

Dear Parent Carer,

Child Flu Vaccination

Children are at risk of suffering from flu, and the flu virus spreads easily especially amongst younger children in enclosed spaces like the classroom. For children with existing health conditions there is a higher risk of serious illness that could lead to hospitalisation.

As temperatures fall again in the coming weeks, getting vaccinated against flu gives your child that vital extra protection from this dangerous virus which spreads more easily in colder weather when we spend more time with friends and family indoors.

All primary school children (from Reception year up to Year 6) are eligible for a free flu nasal spray. The nasal spray is quick and painless, and most children will be able to get it at their school. If you have missed your child's school vaccination, it's not too late – you can still get a flu vaccine from your GP if your child has a long term health condition and is in the 'at risk' category or your local School Aged Immunisation Service as per the details below.




Football Festival

This year we are hoping to answer the following questions:


What issues really matter to children and young people?
