- Testing the size of parachutes and the speed in which they fell


Here are some comments from the children.




Reading for Pleasure Matters at Hunters Hall


Reading interest: 4-8

This fantastically illustrated and highly original hardback presents fairy tale villains in forensic and scientific detail! The wolf, witch, and giant are dissected with a series of clues, strengths, weaknesses, personality traits, and physical attributes. The flaps to lift, "diabolical thoughts", and even the stomach contents are a delight.



Reading interest: 8-12

Narrated in the first person by Ahmet, a nine-year-old Syrian refugee, this story follows how he copes with life in London, and how he plans to find the family he left behind. A masterpiece of empathy with situations and storylines with which children will relate.



Reading interest: Teen-Adult

A self-help style guide to parent-child relationships, and, in particular, what to avoid. Exploring how our own upbringing can affect the way we treat others, it provides valuable tips on how to communicate effectively.

Who are we?

We are four Education Mental Health Practitioner (EMHP), offering early intervention for young people with mild to moderate difficulties.

Our team work closely with young people, parents, and school staff to think together about ways to improve mental wellbeing within your school environment

Who do we work with?

Parents or Carers of pupils from reception to year 6 with mild-moderate levels of:

- Anxiety (e.g. fears, phobias, feeling panicky)
- Challenging behaviour (e.g. struggling to follow rules, temper tantrums, difficulty following requests)

Whole classes or year groups (delivering assembles and workshops)



Aims of our Team

- Provide early psychological support
- Support the school's wholeschool approach to wellbeing
- Signposting to specialist service

Our breakfast club is open term time only Monday to Friday, 7:45 to 8:30am.
