

At Hunters Hall, we believe that every child should have the opportunity to play music.

We would like to offer your child the chance to learn a musical instrument during school hours.

Lessons are open to all children and will be arranged by PianoFunClub.

Piano will be taught by visiting professional tutors with all teaching material provided - Each pupil will receive 10 lessons per term - lessons are booked in and paid for at the beginning of every new term and half term.

The tutors collect children from their classroom for their lessons, Instruments for school lessons will be provided by PianoFunClub.




Reading interest: 4-8

We are four Education Mental Health Practitioner (EMHP), offering early intervention for young people with mild to moderate difficulties. Our team work closely with young people, parents, and school staff to think together about ways to improve mental wellbeing within your school environment

Who do we work with?

Parents or Carers of pupils from reception to year 6 with mild-moderate levels of:

- Anxiety (e.g. fears, phobias, feeling panicky)
- Challenging behaviour (e.g. struggling to follow rules, temper tantrums, difficulty following requests)

Whole classes or year groups (delivering assembles and workshops)



Aims of our Team

- Provide early psychological support
- Support the school's wholeschool approach to wellbeing
- Signposting to specialist service
