We are delighted to inform you that your setting has been awarded an Artsmark Gold Award. Congratulations! Your Statement of Commitment and Statement of Impact have been assessed and we're pleased to share this feedback from our assessors with you:

'The culture of teaching and learning at Hunters Hall Primary School has embedded more deeply since your last Artsmark journey and your ways of working are rich in different forms of cultural and creative practice. Your current Artsmark journey has been underpinned by clear planning and goals. You aimed to develop pupil leadership in the Arts; focus on the development of Arts provision within the school and the wider community; and to develop staff's continuing professional development in all areas of arts & culture. On all these fronts you have met with degrees of success. Partnerships have been important to the way you value the arts and grow your own expertise. But they are now also offering you outlets to showcase your work and model good practice. You have worked with the Music Education Hub, Barking and Dagenham College, The London Symphony Orchestra, ARC Theatre, Freshwater Theatre Company, and Complete PE. Telling us more about how linking up in this way has helped with sharing good practice across different settings and supporting individuals to design a better quality curriculum would be helpful. Leadership and investment in staffing and curriculum design is becoming a real strength in your setting and will allow your arts education practice to flourish in the future. You actively recruit staff who will help enhance your goals for arts rich learning, rather than have to retrain and reinvest when you welcome new teachers on board. And in common with other schools that have more developed arts practices you find yourself moving away from themed weeks and special days, instead using the arts routinely to deliver the basics of the curriculum in a more interesting way. Pupil voice is strong and you have many special interest groups with young people acting as spokespeople for their peers. As you continue with your journey a couple of points worth keeping in mind relate to your own arts practices and partnerships, particularly how to keep them fresh and feeling positive and developmental. And to be clearer about the ways you could lead and advocate for these forms of practice will mean moving beyond descriptions of projects and building accounts of how arts rich pedagogy adds to the overall quality of teaching and learning in general. This will require time to reflect on your own ways of mediating the arts and what the key characteristics are of your successful programmes of work - this might include your use of language in teacher-learner interactions, learning spaces, timetable flexibilities, choosing the right partners, arts resources and how to deploy them, offsite learning - how all of these sorts of feature combine to create your unique approach will be important to describe as your journey continues.'





Uniform Reminder & PE Days 2023-2024

During the course of this academic year, we are phasing out some of our school uniform in an effort to make it more affordable for our parent body.

Our school uniform provider now sells school badges for £1.20 so that you are able to purchase plain white polo shirts/ plain red jumpers/cardigans and iron on the badge. (Our current provider will continue to sell their stock of red and grey uniform items and staff has been informed that it is a gradual phase out)





Year 4 Topic - World War 1




Reading for Pleasure Matters at Hunters Hall


Reading interest: 4-8

We are four Education Mental Health Practitioner (EMHP), offering early intervention for young people with mild to moderate difficulties.

Our team work closely with young people, parents, and school staff to think together about ways to improve mental wellbeing within your school environment

Who do we work with?

Parents or Carers of pupils from reception to year 6 with mild-moderate levels of:

- Anxiety (e.g. fears, phobias, feeling panicky)
- Challenging behaviour (e.g. struggling to follow rules, temper tantrums, difficulty following requests)

Whole classes or year groups (delivering assembles and workshops)



Aims of our Team

- Provide early psychological support
- Support the school's wholeschool approach to wellbeing
- Signposting to specialist service
