

Uniform Reminder & PE Days 2023-2024

During the course of this academic year, we are phasing out some of our school uniform in an effort to make it more affordable for our parent body.

Hopes & Dreams


For all my friends and family to live happy and healthy lives. It would also be lovely to have a grandchild in the future!

Moments matter: Attendance counts

Sometimes we have to notify parents of poor attendance and this can be quite disheartening for parents and some raise concerns about the systems we use. This newsletter is to explain the rationale behind our actions when it comes to attendance and safeguarding all of our children.

The Department for Education (DfE) has stated, 'persistent failure to send children to school is a clear sign of neglect'. The NSPCC has cited, 'failure to ensure regular school attendance which prevents the child reaching their full potential academically' as one of their six forms of neglect.

'Working together to safeguard children' provides a neglect description, 'The persistent failure to meet a child's basic physical and/or psychological needs, likely to result in the serious impairment of the child's health or development'

Support/Action: Attendance Percentage

90-100% All schools should adopt a universal whole school approach (school, parent, child, and community) to attendance:

Ensuring that internal policies and processes are applied to promote good attendance and/or challenge where concerns arise.


70-90% Schools should consider all early help (single agency) options including children's centres, school nursing, inclusion support and police etc or an Early help (FaASS) assessment may be offered.

50-70% Where attendance concerns remain multi-agency (Team around the Family [TAF] or Team around the Child [TAC]) /targeted support may be considered following the completion of an early help assessment. (If consent / cooperation is withheld, intervention by the Attendance Service may be appropriate).

50% or less school attendance should trigger all schools and partners to consider "educational neglect" including the possibility of an Education Supervision Order via the Family Court (if not previously considered/actioned).

No matter how brilliant a school's curriculum, children will not achieve their potential in a school with poor standards of attendance and behaviour. Children with no absence at key stage 4 are almost 2 times more likely to achieve 5 or more GCSEs than children who missed 10-15 percent of lessons. Persistent absence impacts attainment and children's safety, with 90% of young offenders persistently absent, and disruptive behaviour is the most common reason for suspensions and permanent exclusion (34%). There is a demonstrable link between absence and attainment at the end of KS2 and KS4. Pupils with higher attainment at KS2 and KS4 had lower levels of absence over the key stage compared with those with lower attainment.

Some children may need additional targeted support. Lack of attendance will impact on the additional support or interventions taking place and difficult decisions have to be made to decide whether that child remains on the intervention or will the place be given to a child with regular attendance.



Poor punctuality is not acceptable and can contribute to further absence. Good timekeeping is a vital life skill which will help children as they progress through their school life and into the wider world. Pupils who arrive late disrupt lessons and if a child misses the start of the day, they can feel unsettled and embarrassed, miss vital work and important messages from their class teacher.

Leaders are responsible for setting the culture for their school and making sure that all children attend school and learn in calm, orderly, safe and supportive environments, with high expectations for what every child can achieve. Securing the fundamentals of curriculum, behaviour and attendance is vital to achieving our literacy and numeracy missions. This may mean that on occasions parents will receive a letter that they dispute the content of.

Educational neglect, persistent and severe absence are recurring themes in Safeguarding Practice Reviews. In contrast, regular school attendance is a protective factor for the most vulnerable children and young people, providing opportunities for support whilst giving them the best possible start in life.

We believe that "school attendance is everyone's business" (Education white paper)

Professor Jan Horwath, describes "educational neglect as involving a carer failing to provide a stimulating environment, show an interest in the child's education (at school or otherwise), support their learning, or respond to any special needs, as well as failing to comply with state requirements regarding education and attendance".


Reading for Pleasure Matters at Hunters Hall

Reading interest: 4-8


